H. General Remarks:

The third degree in economics was under the guidance of Prof. Gimmi Weinblatt, currently the president of the Sapir Academic Center, and formerly the rector of Ben Gurion University of the Negev. The topic of the research work is: an applied model for general equilibrium for Middle Eastern economies. My research method is an innovative method that does not rely on econometric analyses. The doctorate certificate was awarded at Ben Gurion University of the Negev on June 21, 2006. The study examines the effect of the peace agreements that have been signed (or those that may be signed) on the economy of the economies involved in the political process, mainly those of Israel, the Palestinian Authority, Jordan and Egypt. In the near future I will expand the circle of economies involved in some way in relations with Israel (mainly the countries of the Arab Gulf). The basis of the research was making a future economic forecast resulting from peace agreements with our neighbors in the Middle East.

Today, I am simultaneously working on collecting data from the Arab Gulf countries in order to integrate them into the regional model for general equilibrium in the Middle East.

The first degree was combined with accounting, and still without the exams of the board of accountants, while the second degree was in the specialization of business administration in the department of economics at Ben Gurion University of the Negev.

In 2001, I completed a 60-hour course for directors and those holding senior positions in companies, which was held at the Israeli Center for Management (HMIL) in Ramat Gan. The course ended on 01/24/01 and at the end certificates were distributed.
